Conversation with Youths to Tackle Singapore's Cleanliness Issues Public Hygiene Council looks to work with youths to implement community projects for a truly clean Singapore

Singapore, 17 June 2023 – The "Clean It Forward Conversation with Youths" was held this morning. Organised by the Public Hygiene Council (PHC), this dialogue brought a series of activities and initiatives under the PHC's Keep Clean, Singapore! 2023 (KCS) annual campaign which was launched on 13 May 2023 to a close. Almost 100 youths from youth organisations and institutes of higher learning came together for a meaningful discussion on public cleanliness issues and the roles that youths could play towards making Singapore a cleaner home for all.

- At the Keep Clean, Singapore! 2023 launch event on 13 May, Minister Chan Chun Sing reminded us to remember the larger mission we have. Cultivating younger minds to act towards a truly clean Singapore is not just about having a better quality of life. The larger mission for all of us is to be good stewards, and work with the youths so that we can leave behind a better Singapore for them and the generations to come.
- Today's dialogue was led by a dynamic and diverse group of panellists which comprised youths who are passionate and active advocates of creating a cleaner and more environmentally sustainable Singapore. We were privileged to have Ms Kong Man Jing (Co-founder of the science and environment social media channel *Just Keep Thinking*); Mr Yasser Amin (member of the PHC's Youth Action Group (YAG) and the PHC R.I.S.E, and Chief Stridy Officer, Stridy) and Ms Samantha Thian (Co-Chairman, Public Hygiene Council (PHC) Youth Action Group (YAG), member of the Public Hygiene Council (PHC), and Founder and CEO, Seastainable Co.), who moderated the event. The panellists were also joined by Guest of Honour, Dr Amy Khor, Senior

Minister of State, Ministry of Sustainability and the Environment & Ministry of Transport, and new Chairman of the Public Hygiene Council, Mr Andrew Khng.

- "We all have a part to play in keeping our beloved country clean, and this is a shared responsibility for all. There needs to be a greater ownership towards public spaces and its cleanliness so that in the years ahead, our future generation can also enjoy a clean city, and not just a cleaned one. Meanwhile, the PHC look forward to hearing from youths to share their thoughts on cleanliness issues and propose solutions in making Singapore a cleaner home for all." said Mr Andrew Khng, who recently took over as Chairman of the PHC on 1 June 2023.
- The topics discussed during the dialogue aim to explore how youths can develop impactful solutions and sustainable initiatives to elevate the standard of Singapore's public cleanliness and to keep public spaces clean and litter-free. In an interactive discussion between the panellists and youth participants, key topics included problem statements identified by the YAG were covered during the dialogue were:
- a. Our youths' take on the current conditions of Singapore's cleanliness, and the issues and gaps that need to be addressed.
- b. The role that education can play towards cultivating greater civic mindedness among young Singaporeans, and how it will contribute towards a cleaner Singapore.
- c. Ways to assist businesses to take on the challenges that they face towards maintaining cleanliness.
- d. How business premises can be encouraged to have even higher cleaning and sanitation standards.
- e. What we can do as a community to lessen our reliance on cleaners yet still improve our standard of cleanliness.
- f. Changes which youths hope to see in the cleaning industry and workforce in the next five years.
- g. Youths' expectations for Singapore's public cleanliness in 10 years' time.

- Through this discussion, the PHC and the YAG aim to encourage more youths to share their thoughts on cleanliness issues and propose solutions in making Singapore a cleaner home for all. The PHC and National Youth Council (NYC) are currently accepting application for the Young ChangeMakers (YCM) Grant to help youths to realise ideas that will benefit the Singapore community and society. The programme aims to provide seed funding for youths to implement youth-led ground-up initiatives and solutions that will contribute to greater understanding and awareness of Singapore's public cleanliness standard. It will see youth curators being able to claim up to 80% of total claimable costs (capped at \$\$5,000) and prompt more youths to take action to improve our community and society.
