Mr Edward D'Silva, 72, hopes that more people will take charge of their own rubbish so that Singapore can have very few rubbish bins like Japan.

Lianhe Zaobao recently interviewed Mr D'Silva, who has stepped down as the chairman of the Public Hygiene Council (PHC) on 31 May 2023, and asked him to rate the sanitation level of public toilets. He said that eight years ago, about 90 per cent of the public toilets were unclean. Today, there is a slight improvement, but about 80 per cent of the public toilets remains unclean. He added that these are mainly toilets at coffee shops and hawker centres, excluding those in shopping malls and airports.

Mr D'Silva added that it is necessary to remind Singaporeans that maintaining a clean environment in Singapore is an arduous task. Having said that, during his eight years stint as chairman of the PHC, he has observed improvements in hygiene awareness amongst the young and elderly. In general, more can be done, but the mentality of residents about littering has to change, and that is the hardest part. Mr D'Silva is grateful to the council team, NEA and MSE for their support.

### The Keep SG Clean Comic Strip Competition




Youths are catalysts for change. It is important that we inculcate in them the right values and habits to keep Singapore clean. The cleanliness habits that they learnt in school should continue through their adult years. To engage our youths and inspire them to be more aware of the importance of keeping Singapore clean, the PHC organised the "Keep SG Clean Comic Strip Competition" last year in collaboration with the Ministry of Education (MOE).

This is the second year running that the PHC and MOE have embarked on a partnership to creatively engage and educate students on the importance of cleanliness and good hygiene. The competition attracted a good number of submissions in two categories: "Keep Singapore Clean", and "Clean Public Toilets". Close to 200 entries from 30 schools were received. The top two winners for both categories, Goh Min Xuan, (14 years old) and Goh Min Yan, (14 years old), are sisters who are currently students at Nanyang Girls' High School.

Mr Chan Chun Sing, Minister for Education, presented awards to ten students with the best entries. The ten winning works were on display at the KCS Launch Event and will subsequently be exhibited at selected schools, public transport nodes, major community hubs and shopping malls.

#### SG Clean Day Largest Cleanup sets two entries in the SINGAPORE Singapore Book of Records


In conjunction with the Keep Clean, Singapore! 2023 launch event, the SG Clean Day Largest Cleanup was conducted at F1 Pit Building and across different parts of Singapore on the morning of Saturday, 13 May 2023.

Flagged off by Ms Denise Phua, Mayor of Central Singapore District, the Public Hygiene Council successfully set two entries in the Singapore Book of Records - (i) new record for the Most Number of People in a Multiple-Location Clean-Up and (ii) new record for the Most Number of Participants in a Single-Location Clean-Up. This record breaking communityled effort sought to ignite new conversations and actions by Singapore residents and promote understanding on what it means to care for common spaces beyond the doorsteps of our homes. It also aimed to mould a generation of compassionate youths to step up and champion the keep Singapore clean cause.



The topics discussed during the dialogue aimed to explore how youths could develop impactful solutions and sustainable initiatives to elevate the standard of Singapore's public cleanliness and to keep public spaces clean and litter-free.

## RISE Opportunities for the Singapore Youth


To step up and champion the cause to keep Singapore clean

The National Youth Council (NYC) and the Public Hygiene Council (PHC) are currently accepting applications for the Young ChangeMakers (YCM) Grant to help youths realise cleanliness related ideas that will benefit the Singapore community and society. The programme aims to provide seed funding for youths to implement youth-led ground-up initiatives and solutions that can contribute to greater understanding and awareness of Singapore's public cleanliness standards. Youth curators can claim up to 80% of the total claimable costs (capped at \$\$5,000) and prompt more youths to take action to improve our community and society. Project applications for this Young ChangeMakers grant opened on 17 June 2023 and will close on 12 August 2023.

PHC's Youth Action Group members will mentor the youth groups, and individuals who had successfully submitted innovative ideas and solutions to address <u>community littering issues at shared public spaces</u>.

Project teams are tasked to address this challenge statement:

How can youth develop impactful solutions and initiatives to keep our environment clean and litterfree at shared community spaces?



This collaboration aims to support and mould a generation of Singaporeans who not only have a strong foundation of clean habits, but are also catalysts for change. The PHC looks forward to working with youths to implement community projects, for a truly clean Singapore

Launched in February 2020, the SG Clean Quality Mark was introduced by the National Environment Agency (NEA) as a proactive response to the COVID-19 pandemic which was spreading fast the across the world then. The Public Hygiene Council (PHC) took over the administration in September 2021.

The objective of SG Clean Quality Mark was clear. It was developed and designed to rapidly raise our overall environmental sanitation standards by rallying businesses to uphold good hygiene practices, and instil wider confidence in Singaporeans to continue support our local enterprises.

The certification scheme was a success and this was evident in the transition to endemicity in April 2022 while some countries were still facing high infection rates then. With this transition, the SG Clean Quality Mark was discontinued upon its scheduled expiry on 30 June 2023.

We believe the large number of participating premises also helped us to put the COVID-19 pandemic in check. More than 36,000 premises (childcare facilities, schools, hawker stalls, coffeeshops, public transport nodes, sports facilities, hotels, tourist attractions, and social service facilities, etc) have been certified SG Clean since the inception of the scheme.

However, good hygiene practices still need to be continued to safeguard our public health. Therefore, in place of the SG Clean Quality Mark, the PHC had developed a checklist to guide premises operators to continue the practice of good environmental hygiene routines.

This checklist is now available on PHC website (<u>www.publichygienecouncil.sg</u>). We encourage all premises operators to make us of this list as we strive to make Singapore truly clean!
